




OUR PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY-BASED (CB) PROGRAM

Our unique brand of one-to-one mentoring, in which a child facing adversity is carefully matched with a caring adult mentor in a relationship supported by professional Big Brothers Big Sisters staff members, changes lives for the better forever. Community-Based Mentoring matches trusted, caring, screened adults one-to-one with a child in their community. It's all about one-on-one time spent with the volunteer and child doing things they enjoy — a few hours a week filled with shared interests and activities like:



Each match is unique. Getting together doesn't require a special occasion or expensive activity—just a few hours every week doing things the Little and Big already enjoy. Some Bigs meet their Littles on the weekend — others get together after school. There's almost no one so busy that they can't find a way to fit in a few hours a month.

SITE-BASED (SB) PROGRAM

Site Based, or Lunch Buddies, matches meet each week at the Littles' elementary or middle schools for about a half-hour, taking part in activities like sports, arts and crafts, board games, reading books, doing puzzles and everything in between. Professional HOIBBBS staff provide constant support to matches to ensure child safety and help matches form a trusting bond with each other. Site-Based Bigs are asked to commit at least a year to their Little, over time sharing experiences, having fun, and building a friendship that can last a lifetime!

GROUP MENTORING

Group Mentoring is a powerful opportunity to bring connection, guidance, and growth to Little Brothers waiting to be matched. Through teamwork and shared purpose, our Group Mentors lead engaging activities, build lasting relationships, and create a supportive space where Littles feel seen, valued, and inspired. Meeting once a month for two to three hours, these sessions spark confidence, curiosity, and a strong sense of belonging.
